Through this pledge, cities/municipalities promise to “create habitat for the monarch butterfly and pollinators, and to educate residents on how they can make a difference at home and in their community.” As you may know, since 1990 the eastern population of monarchs has declined by 90% and western populations by 99%, making this commitment particularly important and timely.
